

The Essential Guide to DIY Roof Inspections

Checking up on the health of your roof is easier than you might think. Here's a helpful checklist based on Expert advice, designed to make your DIY roof inspection as smooth (and safe) as possible.

Tools & Equipment	Visual Inspection from the Ground Start with a walk around your home. Look for signs of aging or damage—like broken shingles. Use your binoculars for a closer look.
A sturdy ladder	 Ladder Inspection If you're comfortable, climb up for a closer inspection. Ensure the ladder is secure and have someone spot you for extra safety.
O Non-slip shoes (for secure footing)	 Check the Shingles Look for any that are cracked, loose, or missing. Note any moss or algae growth which can indicate moisture issues.
O A camera (or smartphone)	 Inspect the Gutters Ensure they are attached securely and free of debris. Check for granules from the shingles, a sign of wear.
Pen	 Look at the Joints and Edges Check around chimneys, vents, and where the roof meets the walls. Any cracks or breaks could lead to leaks.
 (or pencil) Binoculars (if you prefer to inspect from the ground) 	 Inspect the Ventilation Make sure vents are clear and unobstructed to ensure proper airflow in your attic.
	 Interior Check Finally, head to your attic. Look for signs of water infiltration like stains or mold, and ensure insulation is intact.

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
